THE STORY OF "THE POPPIES"

The club was founded at a Meeting held in Abbotts Auction Mart in Old Christchurch Road by eight enthusiastic gentlemen presided over by Alderman J Nethercoate (later to become Mayor of Bournemouth) on 11 September 1875. It was decided to call the club Bournemouth Rovers and is one of the oldest clubs in the country being founder Members of the Football Association, the Hampshire F.A. and the Bournemouth F.A.

A brief spell as Bournemouth Dean Park (where an all white kit was chosen) Bournemouth FC was adopted in 1889 having amalgamated with another local side- Bournemouth Arabs. The club was among founder members of the Hampshire League and up to joining the Wessex League in 1986 had played entirely in the Hampshire League, except for a short spell at the turn of the 20th century. Earliest record of playing in the FA Cup was a 6-0 defeat at Kennington Oval against Old Westminsters back on 1 November 1884. The club played the second game in the inaugural Hampshire League campaign of 1896/97, going down 1-0 to Ryde Sports on 12 September 1896, finishing sixth from eight. The club has had three homes during its history with their first ground being at a place called East Common near the Bournemouth railway station and Dean Park (current home of Dorset County Cricket) before moving to Victoria Park, which was formerly a farmer's field

The first taste of County success came in winning the West Division in 1905 and then again in 1910. Poppies became County Division Champions either side of the Great War in 1914 and 1922, picking up the Hampshire League Shield in 1913, with Wheeler scoring 76 goals that season from 47 matches including 9 in a 19 day period. The furthest progress in the FA Amateur Cup came at that time as well, reaching the 3rd Round in 1923/24 but a 1-0 home reverse against Botwell Mission (who in later years became Hayes) put an end to hopes of silverware that time. However in 1929 the club was relegated into the newly formed Division 2 regaining top flight status by winning the Division 2 Championship in 1932. The club languished in the bottom half of Division 1 for several seasons before finally falling back into Division 2 when football restarted after the Second World War. The club recovered some of its past glories by winning the Hampshire Intermediate Cup in 1950 and again in 1970 and 1972.

Division 1 status was regained for the 1979/80 season but relegation quickly followed in 1980/81 and again in 1982/83 when we slipped into Division 3 remaining there until being admitted to the newly formed Wessex League in 1985.

The Poppies Story - Continued

The Wessex League Championship has remained elusive coming close on two occasions with a 3rd place in 1990/91 under the guidance of Tommy Taylor and runners up spot in 1994/5 to Fleet Town when Alex Pike was the manager. The first piece of silverware for a number of years arrived in 2010/11, in the 25th Wessex League season, in the shape of the League Cup, with a 1-0 win over Winchester City. 2011/12 saw the team reach the FA Carlsberg Vase Quarter Final for the first time- going out to 0-2 in a home reverse against West Auckland Town.

Indifferent seasons followed in 2012/13, 2013/14 and last term. The end of 2014/15 couldn't come soon enough as the club were locked in a struggle to avoid the drop from the turn of the year, and only a couple of wins on the road at Andover and Brockenhurst ensured Premier Division safety. The team has again been rebuilt with almost a complete new look squad, we are proud to be the sole club to have played in the top flight in each Wessex League season, and will be looking for a big improvement on last season's ranking. Tuesday 26 November 1878 is another significant date in the club's history- when the club played under experimental electric lights at Dean Park for "a grand exhibition of the new electric light"; conditions weren't perfect though with part of a cinder cycle track cutting the field of play. The club has also changed names; Bournemouth Rovers, Bournemouth Wanderers and also Bournemouth Dean Park for about one year with a rather "modern" kit choice of claret and lemon quarters before evolving into Bournemouth FC in Summer 1889 and absorbing the Arabs a further year on adopting a green kit. The club eventually adopted the colour poppy red in season 1895/6 from green and white hoops hence the club nickname

One of the clubs most famous members was William Pickford (who later became Chairman of the English Football Association). Mr. J Joy, a local landowner and supporter of the club, gave the present Namu Road ground to the club. Bournemouth Council bought the ground after in October 1944 for £3,750 providing a lease on a peppercorn rent. The new clubhouse was opened in 1985- just in time for entering the Wessex League and the current 205-seater stand provides adequate cover from the elements with several rows of bench seating replacing the old wooden stand that was destroyed by fire during 1974.

This stretches about a third of the length of the pitch – next to the glass-fronted clubhouse.

Hamworthy Recreation FC - History



Hamworthy Recreation Football Club was formed in 1948 as Hamworthy Engineering FC and played on the Sports Ground opposite the factory at Fleetsbridge in Poole (where the Tesco supermarket now stands). When the site at Fleetsbridge was sold to Tesco in the late 1980's the football, along with the Sports & Social Club, moved to its current home at Magna Road.

At that time 'Hamworthy Engineering FC' were playing in the Bournemouth League (Division 1). The Club won the Bournemouth Senior Cup in the 1988-89 season, and after winning the Division One Championship in 1990/91 'The Rec' successfully applied to join the Dorset Combination League for season 92/93 when they finished 3rd. Success soon followed when the Club won a hatrick of Combination League Championships in 1993-94, 1994-95 and 1995-96.

'The Rec' have lifted the League Championship Trophy on another nine occasions, 2000/01, 2001/02, 2004/05, 2009/10, 2010/11, 2014/15, 2017/18, 2018/19 and 2021/22. The Club have won the League Cup on six occasions - 2000/01,2006/07, 2007/08, 2013/14, 2014/15 and 2021/22.

'The Rec' consider that their greatest achievement was in 1995, when not only did they win the League Championship, but also won the Dorset Senior Cup, defeating Weymouth Football Club from the Southern League by 3 goals to nil at Magna Road in the Semi-Final, and Poole Town FC, another Southern League team, 4 - 1 in the Final. The 2001-01 season saw the Club change its name to Hamworthy Recreation FC to reflect the name of their current headquarters. Our proud boast – we've never finished below 6th since Ham Eng joined the Combination in 1992/93.

When the Club won promotion to the Wessex League the Reserves moved to The Hampshire Development League, winning Div 1 at the first attempt and finishing a commendable mid table in 20223/24 having been promoted to the Premier Div.. For the 2024/25 season they applied for, and were granted, a place in the Dorset Premier League, in which the Club has such a rich history.

During 2022, with funding support from the Football Foundation and local sponsors' we managed to get the ground upgraded to have floodlights and a 50 Seat Stand and so have progressed to the Wessex League Division 1. We have a Development/Reserves Team, both as a feeder team from our Under 18's and upwards towards our First team.

We now have the following teams and Leagues:

- First Team in the Premier League of the Wessex League
- Reserves in the Dorset Premier League
- Under 18 Team, which for the 2023/2024 Season is totally back within Hamworthy Recreation FC

Match Report by John Hutchings 14 December 2024 Away to AFC Portchester

14.12.24. AFC Portchester 3 Hamworthy Rec 2

Disappointment for Rec in this defeat at title contenders AFC Portchester, but they can take heart from a gutsy performance, especially in the second half, after being outplayed by the hosts in the first. Hotshot, Ryan Pennery had put the Royals in front, with Rec equalising in first half stoppage time. Rec more than matched the home side in the second half, before conceding two more and then pulling one back, late on, to set up a tense finish.

The biggest frustration for Rec was receiving six yellow cards and one red in a game where there was hardly a bad tackle. Referee, Mr Mason, seemed intent on deeming virtually every foul to be a yellow card.

It was the worst possible start for Rec, when on 5m, keeper Callum Watson was forced off with an injury - the "Curse of the Rec Keeper" strikes again! With no sub keeper, midfielder Sonny Pike took up the gloves.

Portchester were putting Rec under intense pressure, with Pennery and Duffin both going close, but it took them until the 33rd minute to go in front, from a debatable penalty. PENNERY sending Pike the wrong way.

But as Rec gradually settled they scored an unlikely equaliser, 4m into stoppage time. Tyler Rudd did well to deliver a low cross from the right, which found its way to HARVEY DOE, at the far post, to steer past Mowthorpe, in the home goal. HT 1-1.

After getting a good talking to at the break, Rec started brightly and were unlucky when Max Wilcock's header clipped the bar. Then new signing, Fabio Manuel, hit a great free-kick into the danger area, only to be gathered by Mowthorpe.

But on 66m the Royals were back in front, much to Rec's annoyance. They had a man down with a head injury, but the ref allowed play to continue and as the ball came in from the left DUFFIN found space, controlled well and shot, low, into the corner for 2-1. Chris Long protested to Mr Mason and promptly received a second yellow, reducing Rec to ten men for the remainder.

Rec tried to rally, but conceded a third, on 84m. A defensive clearance picked out LEE WORT, who ran on and thumped past Pike. But to their credit Rec came back and on 88m Aaron Roberts produced some trickery on the left, burst into the box and teed up TYLER RUDD to side foot high into the roof of the net. FT 3-2.

A defeat, but against a very good side - no disgrace.




